Dear Siblings in Christ,

How do you find rest? Is it easy to find? Or is it elusive some days (or most days)?

Depending on the demands of your job, it may be very difficult to find rest. Or maybe it USED TO BE hard to rest, until you retired. But many retirees tell me they are way busier NOW than when they were working! (By the way, THANK YOU to everyone who freely and generously gives their time to the work and ministry of St. Andrew's. I appreciate YOU, and so do the people we serve!)



Given the demands of my job, I have a hard time finding time to rest. That's why I am so protective of my day off (Monday, if you didn't know). I take a long nap with my cat, Lucy, on Sunday afternoons after church (usually 2-3 hours) and then I try to do something restful and recharging for my soul on Mondays. As some of you now know, I spend a lot of time at a local pottery studio where I am learning how to throw pots on a pottery wheel. Let me tell you, this is great therapy for a recovering perfectionist! Because I am still learning, I have very little control over how those pots will turn out. I have a shape in my mind for what I am going for, and usually the pot doesn't turn out anything like what I was hoping for! But what's so great about this practice is that it requires 100% of my attention. I cannot be thinking about Council agendas or Bible Studies or sermons that need to be written – I must focus all of my attention on the clay in my hands. Otherwise it doesn't turn out guite right. Sometimes I have to dump the whole thing and start over (I'm really good at cutting through the bottom of my pot!).

Isaiah 64:8 reminds us that "Yet, O LORD, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand." I often think about how God created the human beings from the dust of the earth, how God molded and shaped them in God's own image. I wonder how many times God scrapped what God was working on and started over. Or maybe God "got it right" on the first try (sometimes that happens for me, too). When God was done with the clay project, what did God do? God took a day off to rest. And so also should we.

In our go-go-go world, it is hard to make time to rest. But it is important that we do. We all need it. It's good for our bodies and souls; it is also good for our brains. I hope this month we all can find time to rest and recharge, even as we are being molded and shaped by the Master Potter into who and what God is calling us to be.

Go and...Rest

Ah, January... in St. Paul, Minnesota... that is where this South Texas native spent six winters to complete residency requirements while attending Luther Seminary. Minnesota winters are memorable in many ways, like the first time I experienced the inside of my nose freezing or making a snow angel.

One particularly wintry January afternoon, classes completed for the day, I trekked toward the warmth of a good cup of coffee and a buttery almond kringler at the Finnish Bistro, when something caught my eye. Looking up, I saw a single, brilliant sun ray shining through a small gap in the clouds. As I followed the ray, looking slightly over my shoulder towards the steps of the iconic Bockman Hall, a man stood smack dab in the place where that sun ray met the earth. His face was lifted to fully accept the light, without shame or embarrassment. He seemed to rest in the light, which on any other day would have been meager; yet on that day, it appeared as though he was sunbathing on the beach in Florida. By then I had stopped, turned, and was fully staring at this wonder when he caught me. He gave a little shrug and said, "You gotta take it when you can."

Ah, January...in Nebraska. We are entering Epiphany, the season of light in the midst of winter. With others in the Nebraska Synod, we are to contemplate "Go and...rest." Along with the Magi, we follow the light, which leads to the Christ child; not a come-and-go sunray that "You gotta take it when you can," but Christ who is always with us. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it." (John 1:15 NLT) Yet I wonder if we sometimes think the light is too much for us – it shines so brightly in our eyes and we cannot rest following the post-Christmas blues of January winter. Go and...rest. *Yes, my soul, find rest in God; my hope comes from him. Psalm 62:5 (NIV).* During my internship, I was drawn to the idea of Sabbath rest, which now leads to more wondering about Sabbath rest in the light of Emmanuel – God with us. During my Sabbath rest conversations with others, one dear, retired pastor told me he often took Mini Sabbaths during the day. Intentional time of quiet and reflection.

Epiphany is all about wonder – the *aha's* we discover as God is on the move in the world and in our lives. What might we discover with these intentional times of quiet and reflection in Christ's light? Whether one minute, 5 or 10. Stop. Rest. Christ's light shines on us all. PASTOR'S COUNCIL REPORT, JANUARY 2024

- My father, James Lekas, passed away on November 27. The funeral and burial were on December 20 and 21 near Portland, Oregon. I am grateful to the congregation and Council for allowing me some time away to bury my father. I am also grateful for the Memorial gifts that have been given in his name. Thank you for your generosity.
- Mel Michael also passed away on December 15. His funeral was at Lincoln Memorial on December 22. I did not conduct this funeral.
- Christmas Eve was well attended with 110 in person and 5 online.
- 4. Bible Study on Wednesday, Jan 10 was canceled, due to an emergency call to the hospital. Bible Study and Confirmation will resume on January 17. "The Chosen" group will resume in April once Season 4 is released on the app.
- 5. I was invited to lead Vespers on Jan 12 at the Lincoln Senior Apartments, but canceled due to the snowstorm. We rescheduled for Jan 19.
- I met with the Deans and Bishop Scott Johnson via Zoom on Thursday, January 10. Here are some highlights:
 - a. Bishop Eaton is on Sabbatical Leave. There are no known issues (health or otherwise); she just needs some rest. She will return to the helm on March 17, in time for the Council Meeting. In the meantime, Rev. Michael Burke has been serving as Interim Bishop.
 - b. "How To Be A Church Council" will be offered by Emmaus in April 2024. This class will be recorded and made available for pastors and councils to use later on. (Something like this was available back in the day when Dave DeFreese was Bishop. He sent me the video when I first got here and it was very helpful for St. Andrew's.)
 - c. Synod Assembly 2024 will be held on Saturday and Sunday (not Friday and Saturday). Bishop believes this makes sense for people who have to travel a long distance, as well as for our lay members who might otherwise have to take the day off. Worship on Sunday morning will be live-streamed and congregations are encouraged to tune in and watch together. More details are coming. A printed sermon will be sent to all of us for a lay member to read, in case live-streaming is not available.
 - d. The NE Synod Mission Trip will be going to Oklahoma this year on March 11-15. They are planning to go to Norman to help with tornado recovery work. More details should be coming out in the next week or so.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS, JANUARY 2023

- Charlotte Pasco came and gave a report on church repair needs. Her list includes: fixing the pitch on the sanctuary roof, resurfacing the church parking lot, installing automatic handicap doors in the Narthex, new inlay rug by the office entrance, replace stone tiles by the office entrance, replace broken tiles in the craft room, replace the kitchen dishwasher (or fix the plumbing), and tree maintenance.
- 2024 Midweek Lenten Offerings and Holy Week Offerings will be designated to World Central Kitchen.
- 3. Golden Ladle Soup Competition will be after the Annual Meeting on January 28.
- Ryan Bates will be the Social Media Coordinator. He will be starting in this position soon. Ryan would like to highlight what we do well on Social Media.
- Pastor's Report: Pastor's father (Nov 27), Mel Michael (Dec 15), and Dan Wolff (Jan 15) passed away. Synod Assembly will be June 1-2, Saturday and Sunday. Sunday morning worship will be livestreamed.
- 6. Treasurer's Report: Checking Balance Opening: \$10,020.45. Ending balance: \$35,982.36. Savings Balance Opening: \$44,171.72. End: \$34,176.24
- Regular giving in December was \$28,166.81 more than the budget estimate. Year
 to date regular giving is less than the budget estimate by \$17,031.92. Special
 giving for December was \$6,952.76.
- 8. St. Andrew's gave away \$50,000 last year (this is what we can track and does not include tangible gifts, like MOM or Food Pantry donations).
