Dear Siblings in Christ,

Happy New Year! As we look ahead to 2023, I trust that God has many exciting things in store for St. Andrew's! I look forward to walking with you and discovering these many gifts together!



Once of the most highly anticipated gifts coming to us in 2023 is a Social Media Intern. There have been many questions about this: Who is this? WHAT is this? What is it for? Can the money be better spent somewhere else? What is social media? Why do we need it at St. Andrew's? And maybe there are more than these, but these are some of the questions I have been hearing (or that have been asked of me directly). So let's unpack this!

Social Media (in case you don't know) is the use of online platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, YouTube and the like to promote communication of one's business, ministry, or other activities. Of course these things are not limited to professional use — many people post things to keep friends and family informed of what is happening in their lives. It's a great way to get the word out about important life events, such as births, deaths, serious illnesses, and so on. It's also a great outlet for silly things, like cat photos and videos! Sometimes people just post a picture of what they had for dinner. Social Media can be used for many things, and it is a great way for us to be connected with others and to be Reaching Out — Sharing Grace with our neighbors in town and beyond!

The hope of a Social Media Intern at St. Andrew's is to identify someone (hopefully a college student who needs practical hours for their degree) to help us with this online media presence. Since Pandemic, St. Andrew's (and all other worshipping communities, frankly) have been catapulted into the realm of online media. Churches are notoriously "late adopters," meaning that we are the last ones "to come to the party" on the new ideas of technology and society. (Martin Luther was most definitely an exception to this rule!) Businesses, university and educational settings, etc. almost always outpace us when it comes to embracing new ideas, especially when it comes to technology. The Pandemic forced us all to take a quantum leap into the future and join the rest of the crowd who has been using tech in this way for years.

Because there is only one of me and I have many things to do, and because the others on the Tech Team also have full-time jobs and cannot devote a lot of attention to our online media presence, Council wondered if we could not only use someone who is well-versed in such things but maybe we could also provide a learning opportunity to a student who is pursing a degree in this area. Thus the idea for a Social Media Intern was born!

At this time, we do not have someone identified for this position. Gene Veburg, 2022 Vice President and Chair of Personnel, has been working diligently all summer to find someone to start this position in Fall 2022. He contacted at least four colleges and universities, including Doane, Southeast Community College, Nebraska Wesleyan, and University of Nebraska Lincoln. Because of a variety of circumstances, including the totally shutdown of one institution's internet and email system, we didn't get much interest from any of these places. Just this December, a casual comment was made to Ken Osborn, who used his connections at Union College to make some introductions to their Communications Department. There is DEFINITELY some interest there by two of the professors. Those conversations are being scheduled now (at the writing of this article) and hopefully we will have some forward movement soon!

As you know, finances at St. Andrew's are tight, but we give thanks to God that after five rather lean years, things have stabilized! That being said, that doesn't mean that we have extra money available for a Social Media Intern. The Immanuel Vision Foundation (a serving arm of Nebraska Synod) offers grants for starting new ministries, up to \$10,000 per year. When I heard about this grant opportunity at Synod Assembly in June, I wondered if we might qualify for such a grant for the Social Media Intern. Last fall, Gene and Charlotte Burke worked hard on the paperwork for the grant application and submitted it at the end of September. In mid-November, we were notified that we had been granted \$6000.00 for this project!

The parameters of the grant are very specific. The \$6000 can ONLY be used to fund the position of a Social Media Intern. We have enough money for one intern in Spring 2023 and one intern in Fall 2023. If we decide to continue down this road and that the Social Media Intern is helpful and is a position that should be continued at St. Andrew's, we can apply for another grant for 2024. This grant is renewable for perpetuity, but only on an annual basis. There are several things we need to do during the year, including reporting to Immanual Vision Foundation how we are spending the money and how things are going.

Now the big question: why do we need this at St. Andrew's? The short answer is because we feel called to grow our ministries and our outreach to the community in the name of Christ. And as I stated before, because of Pandemic and because of this huge leap churches and other businesses have taken in their online presence, we are learning that most people, when looking for a place to worship, start online and visit the church website. The website has literally become the "front porch" of the church, and we need to make a good impression! To have success here, it will be helpful to have some additional staff. I do not have the time to do it, nor do I have the expertise the is required to make it happen. I have figured out a lot of things with technology in the last five years, but I could use some help in this specific area. Someone who is working toward a degree in Communications will know far more than any of the rest of us!

We expect the Spring and Fall semesters of 2023 to look something like this:

1. Identify a Social Media Intern in the Spring Semester, and likely again in the Fall. This will be done by interviewing the college professors at Union College, followed by interviewing a few of their best students. At Union, 200 internship hours are required for a degree in Communications, which will suit us perfectly!

- 2. Once the student has been identified, we will ask them to look at what we are currently doing and give us an analysis. What are we doing well? What can be improved? Where do we need to expand?
- 3. The next phase will be to develop an online persona. Who is St. Andrew's? What are we all about? How can a First-time Guest gain access to us, both in person and online? The Social Media Intern will be able to help us design and maintain our online presence.
- 4. The Final Phase will be to implement these ideas and get things rolling. We will also be looking at accessibility, especially for our homebound members, and make sure they have what they need to join us online for worship and other activities. This Final Phase will also include improving WiFi access throughout our building, especially in the Library corner of the church.

You can anticipate a Faith Forum in late January or early February where we will have a "how to" session on how to use some of these things. How do you get to the website? To St. Andrew's YouTube Channel? You may want to watch my Daily Devotions but have NO IDEA how to get there. For that Faith Forum, please bring your device (phone, Tablet or iPad, laptop, etc.) and we will make sure you know how to get connected to us!

What an exciting time to be the Church! This is a great thing we are embarking upon, and a tremendous opportunity to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ in ways we may have never dreamed of before! Please stay tuned as things develop, and please keep this budding ministry in your prayers.

Please contact Pastor Kim, Gene Veburg, or Jim Yankech if you have any questions. We need your help, and we hope you will attend. Thank you!





COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS DECEMBER 2022

- 1. Pat Harris asked for approval to purchase a new vacuum to use in the Fellowship Hall. Undesignated Memorial Funds will be used for this.
- 2. Curt Weller was appointed to be Church Treasurer for 2023.
- 3. Cindy gave an update on the Reading Program at Meadow Lane School. There will be a change this time volunteers will read to 2nd Graders to help establish fluency. Readers may read to the kids, or the kids may read to the volunteer. Sign ups will be available soon.
- 4. Gene has reached out to two professors at Union College in Communications, who have several students in mind for candidates for our Social Media Intern. Look for an article in the January StAnd.
- 5. Breakfast is being served to the kids in the morning on Sundays. If there is more interest in breakfast for other children, we can expand this area of hospitality.
- 6. A Sunday School Coordinator is needed.
- 7. Two biohazard kits have been ordered, in case of spills at church. One is in the nursery and the other is in the church office.
- 8. A Task Force has been appointed to brainstorm about how to staff the nursery, who we can hire, how we can seek out applicants, etc. This meeting will take place on Sunday, January 15 after worship.
- A Young Family Meeting will be called for February 5 after worship to engage our young families in Faith Formation strategies. A meal will be provided.
- 10. It was presented to Council that several unusable donations have found their way into the church. This includes books, stuff animal toys, children's chairs, and others. Before making an item donation to the church, please make sure it is something the church can use. Please do not simply drop off items without checking with the pastor or council president.
- 11. Regular giving in November was \$1,541.35 above the budget estimate. Year to date regular giving is less than the budget estimate by \$44,625.69. Special giving for November was \$864.64. November was a good month and giving was above budget. Thanksgiving Offering (undesignated) was sent to the Brian Maas Leadership Fund at Nebraska Synod.
- 12. Opening balance of the checkbook in December was \$8819.86. Closing balance was \$11,175.00. Opening balance of savings was \$34,113.44 and closing was \$34,115.29. Backpack balance \$5702.20 the first semester has been paid. There was a big repair needed with the boiler for the sanctuary.
- 13. Election Meeting: Doug Wageman was appointed Financial Secretary for 2023.
- 14. Gene Veburg was elected President of Church Council for 2023. Charlotte Burke was elected Vice President. Laura Hahn was elected to serve a second term as Secretary.
- 15. Thank you to Cindy McVicker and Greg Riege for their service on Church Council, and welcome to new members Julie Cummings and Curt Weller.



PASTOR'S COUNCIL REPORT DECEMBER, 2022

- 1. Thanksgiving Eve Worship was well-attended with 46 in person and 6 online. Those present enjoyed pies in the Atrium afterwards. (Four 12-inch pies were purchased from Sam's and donated by a member of the congregation.)
- 2. Pastor Jacob Krueger was ordained at Grace Lutheran Church on Saturday, December 3. He has been called to serve Zion Lutheran Church in West Lincoln/Emerald.
- 3. Rachel Oakeson will be baptized on December 18 when her family joins the congregation. Her son, Asher, was baptized on December 4. Husband Jeff will also be accepted into membership.
- 4. The Monthly Clergy Bible Study/Book Study is dissolving, due to lack of interest. I started this group 12 years ago when I first came to Lincoln. There is a weekly Text Study at American Lutheran that will take its place. Future Lincoln Cluster Clergy Gatherings will be every other month at Scooters at 84th and Van Dorn.
- 5. I completed the 10 two-part Master Classes offered by Vibrant Faith. They were all excellent and will give me some good ideas for things to implement with the congregation in 2023.
