Dear Siblings in Christ,

As I write this to you, I am preparing to go bury my father. He fell in early November, fractured his back and a few ribs, and never recovered. The first funeral was in Winchester, Virginia (where he lived with my brother and sister-in-law); the second December 20 in McMinnville, Oregon (where he lived with my mother for 30 years before she died in July 2020).



Christmas will look a little different for me this year. I haven't lived near my biological family for nearly 30 years; life in the church will do that to a person. But somehow knowing that I can no longer visit my parents (when I would be able to) is a little bit different. There is a painful finality to that knowledge that was a bit unexpected for me.

We heard Isaiah remind us on December 10 how God longs to "comfort, o comfort my people" (Isaiah 40:1), and I'm sure many of us need to hear those words right now. All of us are missing loved ones this holiday season; some are recently deceased, and some may have been gone for a long time. Even so, we might look at the chair they used to

occupy at our holiday tables and we miss them.

But even as we miss our loved ones who have gone on before us to The Church Triumphant, we do not live as people who have no hope. Paul reminds us in 1 Thessalonians 4:14 'For since we believe that Jesus

died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died." Christmas really brings this promise home, for it is at this time we celebrate the event that started it all – the birth of Christ. There is a lot of promise wrapped up in those swaddling clothes and laying in a manger. That child brings hope, peace, and comfort into the world in a way no one had ever seen before. That child grew into a man who lived, loved, and taught us what God was really like. And then he died at the hands of the State because the people in power did not like what he had to say. But that was not the end of the story; it was only the beginning! Jesus rose from the grave on the 3rd Day and made it possible for all who believe in him to have eternal life in his name! At a time of year when many of us are missing loved ones, this is a powerful promise, and one that brings great comfort.

As you gather around your Christmas tables this year (and you probably already have, by the time you read this), I trust you will remember those who are no longer there with you. I also trust that you will find hope, comfort, peace, and maybe even a little joy in knowing that even as we feast, our beloved ones are also dining at The Great Feast of Christ that knows no end.

Merry Christmas! Happy New Year!

Beloved in Christ,

The season of Advent is here, and with it comes a question that has always fascinated me: what does it mean for God to become incarnate? Why would God want to bother with being born? Swaddling clothes? Diaper rash? Puberty? There are so many things about our bodies and our lives embodied in them that seem so incredibly embarrassing and unseemly; are we meant to believe that Jesus knew – and perhaps *wanted to know* – what it's like to have body odor?

We believe and confess that God did, in fact, enter this existence as a person in Jesus of Nazareth, taking on our human form and becoming present in flesh and blood, just like all the rest of us ever have been and ever will be. How it worked remains a mystery we will only receive by faith. What it means is a question we have been answering for thousands of years, and will continue to do so for however many years remain until Jesus returns.

One of the things I believe about God's presence in Jesus is this: God means for us to see this world as a realm worthy of God's presence. This is an idea with which we have struggled, particularly those philosophical strains within human thought that have mistrusted bodies and preferred to believe that there is a way to escape or separate our minds and our souls from this inferior flesh in which we are somehow held captive. The incarnate Jesus stands against this idea, and also against the idea that this earth in which we live and from which we are made is somehow lesser, a realm to be escaped rather than

enjoyed.

Perhaps one of the reasons Jesus was born in a stable rather than a palace was to hallow the very earthiest of circumstances with his presence. When I was a farm kid whose chores included mucking out hog houses and feeding cattle, it never once occurred to me that the odors that came with that sort of work would have been present, perhaps strongly so, on that holy night so long ago in Bethlehem. God entered this messy, dirty, smelly, imperfect world and blessed it by being fully present here: we should do the same wherever we go in this messy, dirty, smelly, imperfect world.

O come, O Child of Mary, come, who once was pleased to make this world your home. In flesh and blood you lived to bless, embodied lovingkindness. Rejoice! Rejoice!

Immanuel shall come to you, O Israel.

If the Word believed that taking on flesh and blood and moving into the neighborhood was good, then so should we believe that being fully present in our own lives is good. Go and be present, dear church. A blessed Advent and Christmas to you all.

GO AND...

BE PRESENT

As we await and celebrate Christ's birth, we remember that God is present and shows up. The babe in the manger, God Incarnate, is God's gift of deep love for us. We are invited to pause, be still, and be fully present in this holy season. Society calls us to a different place where busyness, spending, and rushing about are marks of success. God, in Christ, offers another way: Emmanuel – God with us.

Questions to Consider:

- What can I add to this season that would truly allow me to pause?
- What tradition do you have that nurtures being present at this time of year?
- As you are on the GO, how are you going to practice being present?

Prayer: Emmanuel, you are present with us. Help us be present with each other. Amen.

TO THE CONGREGATION OF ST. ANDREWS:

The following proposed amendment to the constitution is created at the request of the Nominating Committee to revise the terms of elected Council members to 2 year terms with the potential to serve for three sequential 2-year terms, a possible six years on the Council. Currently, elected Council members serve a three year term and can be re-elected for an additional three year term for a possible six years on the Council.

The Council approved the proposed amendment at its December 12, 2023 meeting. The amendment shall be voted upon at the January 28, 2024 Congregational meeting. A simple majority at that meeting will pass the amendment. If passed, the amendment will be subject to ratification at a special meeting in December 2024 prior to the Budget and Election meeting. The ratification vote requires a 2/3 majority at that meeting.

The text for the proposed Constitutional Amendment is as follows:

An amendment to the Congregational Constitution Section C13.02.

This amendment provides for a change in the term and number of consecutive terms for Congregational Council members.

The amendment shall state that elected Council members shall serve a term of two (2) years and may be re-elected for three (3) sequential terms. This amendment shall take effect for the 2025 fiscal year.


