Dear Siblings in Christ:

[Jesus said:] Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. ⁸For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. –Matthew 7:7-8



Go and...ask. Jesus invites us to ask of him whatever we want. But we must be careful because this does not mean that God is "Santa Claus" or some sort of cosmic vending machine, as in if we "put in" the right prayers or are very good, God will do whatever we want. Jesus instead invites us to cast our cares and concerns upon him (1 Peter 5:7) and let him take care of it. This is not always easy to do.


In his book <u>Just Like Jesus</u>, Max Lucado writes about comparing our worries to garbage. When we haul our household garbage to the curb, we leave it there and don't look back. We might even call the garbage company and complain if the trash is not picked up the next day. And yet when it comes to our troubles, which we are supposed to haul to the Lord and leave at his feet, we sometimes have a hard time leaving those behind and walking away. At least I do. I'll pray about this or that and *think* I am leaving those things (or persons) at the feet of Jesus. But before I know it, I have picked them right back up again and am fussing about what *I* am going to do about whatever it is.

There are two mistakes here: one is thinking *I* can somehow handle things better than the Lord can and two, that I did not let it go in the first place. I wouldn't go out and pull the trash back in, thinking that I need to keep it, "just in case." So, Lucado asks, why do we do that with our cares and concerns?

The focus of Nebraska Synod this month is to "Go and...ask." Ask questions. Ask for what we need. Ask the Lord for help to forgive, to provide, to whatever. The Lord will hear us, answer us, and give us all that we need.

Beloved in Christ,

During the Fall Conference of Bishops in Chicago [in September], I spent some time inviting my colleagues to lift up the questions they'd like to ask of you. So here are some questions you could spend some time pondering this month, from myself and from bishops around the ELCA:

- 1. How would you live differently if you didn't know Jesus?
- 2. What about your congregation is compelling enough that someone would want to be a part of it?
- 3. What would your community miss if your congregation was no longer there?
- 4. What is God up to in your context? Where have you seen God working in your congregation/ministry/life in the past month?
- 5. How did you come to be part of the Lutheran movement within the church?
- 6. What's your favorite hymn or worship song, and why?
- 7. Is there one passage of scripture that has a particularly strong meaning for you? If so, what is it, and how has it impacted your life?
- 8. How's your prayer/devotional/spiritual life? When it's good, what makes it so? When you're struggling, how do you struggle?
- 9. How are you praying for your pastor, deacon, bishop, and other church leaders?
- 10. What's your hope for the future of the ELCA, and where is the Holy Spirit calling you to go as a part of that future?
- 11. Who are the mentors and partners that have made a difference in your faith? Have you shared your thanks with them lately?
- 12. What does your family do to build up faith together? What at-home or family practices have been meaningful to you?

- 13. Have you invited anyone to consider if God is calling them into leadership in the church recently?
- 14. What books have made you think about faith or God recently? Were they religious in nature? Fiction? Non-fiction?
- 15. Who are some of your most beloved figures in the Bible? What about their story makes an impact on your own?
- 16. What was your Confirmation verse? Does it mean the same to you today as it did on the day you were confirmed?
- 17. If you could be part of one story in the Bible, or in the history of the church, what would it be?
- 18. What would you most like to ask God, if given the chance?
- 19. What do you love most about the Nebraska Synod?
- 20. Why does Jesus matter in your life?

Ponder away, friends – it's a great month for asking these and other good questions as disciples of Jesus together in this church.



- 1. Beverly Scott, Chad Scott, and Hannah Bates joined the congregation on October 1.
- 2. I took 4 vacation days (October 2-5) to rest and to celebrate my birthday.
- 3. The Revelation Bible Study is going well. The group asks challenging questions and I find myself learning a lot.
- 4. I really like the new confirmation curriculum, "A Toolbox for Faith.". It is challenging having only 1 student.
- 5. I met with Joel Stoltenow from Lutheran Family Services to hear more about the new post-COVID vision from LFS. The M.O.M. for February 2024 will support one of their new endeavors entitled "Well-Being Box," which is full of cleaning supplies and basic household necessities and will be given to refugee families as they settle in Lincoln.
